General Description

Job summary: For many children, the Trojan Kid's Club (extended care) program is an important part of their day and the people who work there have a significant impact on the lives. Before school and from the end of the school day until parents pick up participants, the program provides structured activities and help with homework. The program also runs throughout the summer as a Summer Adventure Program. Type of position: This is a part-time position that is paid on an hourly basis.

- Evidence the fruit of the Spirit in dealing with people.
- Share the Christian faith with others.
- Have a Christ-centered home.
- Actively participate in a local Bible-believing church.

Availability

• The Trojan Kid's Club Aide position is year-round except on major holidays. Care is provided on school days, 1/2 days, most school holidays and in the summer.

It is expected that the Trojan Kid's Club Aide will ...
